

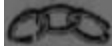

Funeral Services For

Alfred Emmons Saturday

Alfred Emmons, for 60 years a resident of St. Johnsbury who passed away at his home on Pine street early Thursday morning will be laid to rest in Mt. Calvary Cemetery on his 71st birthday, Saturday, following funeral services conducted by the Rev. J. M. H. Bastien at the Notre Dame Church at 8.30 in the morning. Although not in the best of health for three years, Emmons' final illness was a short duration, lasting scarcely three days. Failing health forced him to retire from the Fairbanks shops three years ago.

He was born in Drummondville, P. Q., Nov. 22, 1859, the son of Alfred and Mary Dionne Emmons. He received his early education in Drummondville while his education was completed in St. Johnsbury. He was united in marriage with Zoe Castonguay of Quebec, Nov. 24, 1879. The couple celebrated their golden wedding anniversary a year ago. Mr. and Mrs. Emmons had 10 children, eight of whom survive.
