Mrs. F. Campagna Was Born on Site of Happyland Fifty Years Ago

A woman born in Winnipeg more than half a century ago and the daughter of one of the original party of six white men who were the first to come west from what was then known as Canada, is now visiting her brothers in this vicinity after an absence of twenty-eight years.

The woman is Mrs. Frank Campagna

and she lives at Bismarck, N. D., where her husband is a prosperous farmer.

Her maiden name was Hogque and her father, the intrepid pioneer, hailed from Quebec. She was born and reared on the site of what is now Happyland, which in the old days was her father's farm. She says that her father's descendants now number over one thousand souls.

Mrs. Campagna is here to pay a visit to her three brothers (Hogque) one of whom lives at St. Charles village, one on a farm in the municipality and another at Sturgeon Creek.
