FORT KENT — Roy R. Soucy, 67, died Jan. 25, 1994, at a Fort Kent hospital. He was born in Fort Kent, Jan. 28, 1926, the son of Baptiste and Victoire (Charette) Soucy. Mr. Soucy was a Fourth Assembly member of the Fort Kent Knights of Columbus, Council No. 0352 for more than 40 years; a charter member and past director for 12 years of Fort Kent Federal Credit Union; a member of Rotary International; and a member of Fort Kent Rotary Club. He was a member and past president of the Electrical Association of Aroostook; a member of the Maine Pilots Association; director and past secretary/treasurer of the Northern Aroostook Regional Airport Authority; past school board director of SAD No. 27; past vice chairman of the Fort Kent Zoning Board; and a member of the Fort Kent Committee. In 1978, he was appointed by Gov. James P. Longley to the Maine Electrical Examiners Board and served as chairman for two years and was reappointed by Gov. Joseph Brennan for a nine year term. He was owner of Roy R. Soucy Electrical in Fort Kent for 30 years, retiring in 1989. Surviving are his wife, Germaine (Pelletier) Soucy of Fort Kent; three daughters, Mrs. John (Claudette) O'Connell of Bangor, Mrs. Alan (Ruth) Lampietro of Carver, Mass., Greta Soucy Harvey of Fort Kent; one sister, Mrs. Valere (Doris) Boucher of Fort Kent; one brother, Reynold Soucy of Fort Kent; six grandchildren, J.J. and Brian O'Connell, Cheryl and James Harvey, Melina and Michael Lampietro; many nieces and nephews.
