

## James Soucy, 53, Dies Of Heart Attack While At Races Near Ottawa

Lisbon — James T. Soucy, 53, died about 11 p.m., Wednesday (Sept. 8, 1965) in Civic Hospital, Ottawa, where he was admitted a few minutes earlier after suffering a heart attack at the race track at Stittsville, near Ottawa. He had had a heart condition for the past few months.

The funeral will be 9:30 a.m., Saturday at the Fox Funeral Home here and at 10 o'clock at Sts. Philip and James Church here. The Rev. William E. LaVallee will officiate and burial will be in St. Marys Cemetery, Ogdensburg.

Surviving Mr. Soucy are his wife, Dorothy; two sons, Timothy, Maspeth, L.I., and Michael, at home, who was with his father when he was stricken; two daughter Mrs. James (Barbara) LaDuke, Mt. Holly, N.J., and Phyllis, at home; his mother, Mrs. Kelly (Mary) Delancette, Tupper Lake; and three brothers, Raymond, Springfield, Mass., and Beldon and Gordon, both of Tupper Lake.

Mr. Soucy was born at Churubusco, Feb. 17, 1912, a son of Mary Benjamin Soucy and the late James Soucy. On Nov. 23, 1939, he married Dorothy Gardner of this village, the ceremony being performed in Sts. Philip and James Church by the Rev. James Gaynor.

Mr. Soucy had been employed in the research department at the Alcoa plant for the past 23 years.

He was a member of Sts. Philip and James Church, the Lisbon Volunteer Fire Department Inc. and the Norwood Rod and Gun Club.
